Report of the Trustees for the Year Ended 30 September 2019

The trustees who are also directors of the charity for the purposes of the Companies Act 2006, present their report with the financial statements of the charity for the year ended 30 September 2019. The trustees have adopted the provisions of Accounting and Reporting by Charities: Statement of Recommended Practice applicable to charities preparing their accounts in accordance with the Financial Reporting Standard applicable in the UK and Republic of Ireland (FRS 102) (effective 1 January 2015).

OBJECTIVES AND ACTIVITIES Objectives and aims Charitable Objects:

To promote, maintain, improve and advance education for public benefit by encouragement of the arts.

To promote the benefit of the inhabitants of Leith and its environs without distinction of sex, sexuality, political, religious or other opinions by associating the local statutory authorities, voluntary organisations and inhabitants in a common effort to advance education and to provide facilities, or assist in the provision of facilities, in the interest to social welfare for recreation and other leisure-time occupation so that their conditions of life may be improved; and

To promote, establish, operate and/or support other schemes and projects charitable in law for the benefit of the community of Leith and its environs.

Strategic Aims:

To advance education through promotion of the arts

To promote, establish, operate and/or support other schemes and projects of a charitable nature for the benefit of the community within Leith and surrounding neighbourhoods.

Principal Activity

Leith Festival is a community festival held each year over 10 days in June. The Festival provides the opportunity for a wide range of community organisations and local people to celebrate the community spirit and develop new skills and confidence building measures through the experience of organising and delivering a wide range of performances and events.

ACHIEVEMENT AND PERFORMANCE

The Charity has continued to deliver of a wide range of community based performances and events throughout the year. Leith Festival has continued to promote, improve and advance education and provide local people with the opportunity to celebrate their community spirit at a level comparative with its current level of income. This year there was a net deficit of £1,030. This was due in the main to a reduction in fundraising events income. Gala Day costs of £11,472 continue to be the main area of expenditure. Sponsorship, amounting to £8,030, from local business and organisations remains strong and for which the Leith Festival Board is very grateful. Leith Festival continues to work closely with the community.

Three grants were awarded to Leith Festival Association Ltd during this financial year. £1,000, unrestricted grant, from Foundation Scotland which contributed to Gala Day running costs. Plus £8,750, the second year of a restricted fund Volunteer Programme from the Volunteer Action Fund, now rebranded as Impact Funding Partners. Finally, £6,500, a restricted grant, from the One City Trust for a 17 week Banner Making project commencing October 2019.

FINANCIAL REVIEW

Reserves policy

The charity has consistently followed a policy of accumulating annual surpluses to provide a reserve for future years where there may be a deficit.

No upper limit is set for the reserves but it should be maintained at a level to provide one year's Gala day costs and ideally the funds for a part time Freelance Festival Coordinator post.

FUTURE PLANS

The Leith Festival plans to continue to promote its charitable objectives of advancing education through promotion of the arts for the benefit of the community within Leith and its surrounding environs. It is envisaged that Leith Festival will aim to increase the range of events as capacity and appetite allow.

Report of the Trustees for the Year Ended 30 September 2019

STRUCTURE, GOVERNANCE AND MANAGEMENT

Governing document

The trustees present their report with the financial statements of the charity for the year ended 30 September 2019.

The charity operates under the name Leith Festival Association Ltd. The charity is a private company limited by guarantee and is recognised by the Office of Scottish Charities Regulator as a Scottish charity (number SC283758). The registered office is, 17 Academy Street, Leith, Edinburgh, EH6 4NS.

The charity is governed by its constitution which was formally adopted at the first Annual General Meeting, held on 7 March 2006.

Recruitment and appointment of new trustees

The AGM has been moved to December in order to align better with the festival year and to encourage new Trustees involvement. The induction process for new trustees has been developed in 2019.

Trustees of the management board are elected by the members of Leith Festival Association Ltd.

All the trustees', being eligible, offer themselves for re-election at the Annual General Meeting.

All major operating decisions are decided by the Board of Directors.

Founding Trustee/Director Mary Moriarty stood down in June 2019 after decades of service and continues to support the work of Leith Festival. The Board wishes to acknowledge her unique and invaluable contribution over the years.

Risk management

The trustees have examined the major strategic business and operational risks which the charity faces and confirms that systems are in place to enable regular reports to be provided so that necessary steps can be taken to minimise any potential risks.

1. ACCOUNTING POLICIES

Basis of preparing the financial statements

The financial statements of the charitable company, which is a public benefit entity under FRS 102, have been prepared in accordance with the Charities SORP (FRS 102) 'Accounting and Reporting by Charities: Statement of Recommended Practice applicable to charities preparing their accounts in accordance with the Financial Reporting Standard applicable in the UK and Republic of Ireland (FRS 102) (effective 1 January 2015)', Financial Reporting Standard 102 'The Financial Reporting Standard applicable in the UK and Republic of Ireland' and the Companies Act 2006. The financial statements have been prepared under the historical cost convention.

Income

All income is recognised in the Statement of Financial Activities once the charity has entitlement to the funds, it is probable that the income will be received and the amount can be measured reliably.

Expenditure

Liabilities are recognised as expenditure as soon as there is a legal or constructive obligation committing the charity to that expenditure, it is probable that a transfer of economic benefits will be required in settlement and the amount of the obligation can be measured reliably. Expenditure is accounted for on an accruals basis and has been classified under headings that aggregate all cost related to the category. Where costs cannot be directly attributed to particular headings they have been allocated to activities on a basis consistent with the use of resources.

Tangible fixed assets

Depreciation is provided at the following annual rates in order to write off each asset over its estimated useful life.

Plant and machinery

- 25% on reducing balance

Taxation

The charity is exempt from corporation tax on its charitable activities.

Fund accounting

Unrestricted funds can be used in accordance with the charitable objectives at the discretion of the trustees.

Restricted funds can only be used for particular restricted purposes within the objects of the charity. Restrictions arise when specified by the donor or when funds are raised for particular restricted purposes.

Further explanation of the nature and purpose of each fund is included in the notes to the financial statements.
